International situations

REDD+ under UNFCCC are not agreed.

Governments enterprises and NGOs have already initiated REDD+ activities on their own initiative.

Actions by the Japanese government

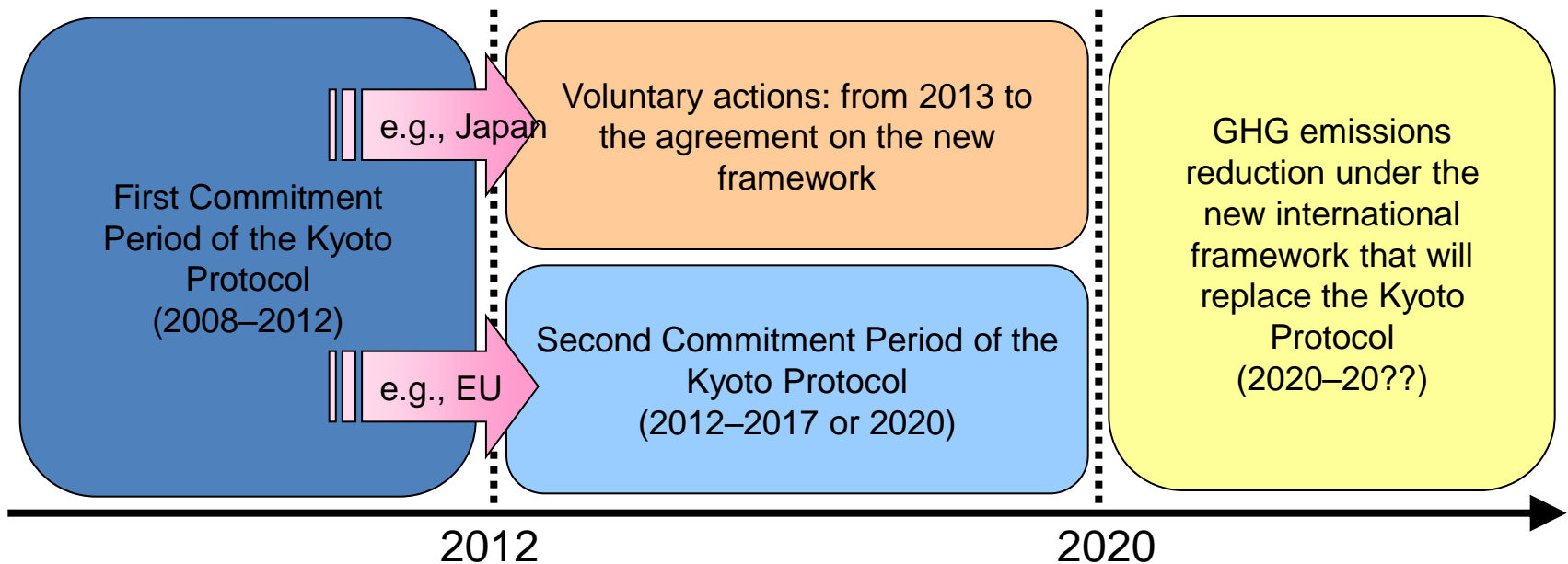
Japan proposes bilateral carbon offset mechanism, and takes interested in REDD+ as an activities.

Issues of implementing REDD+

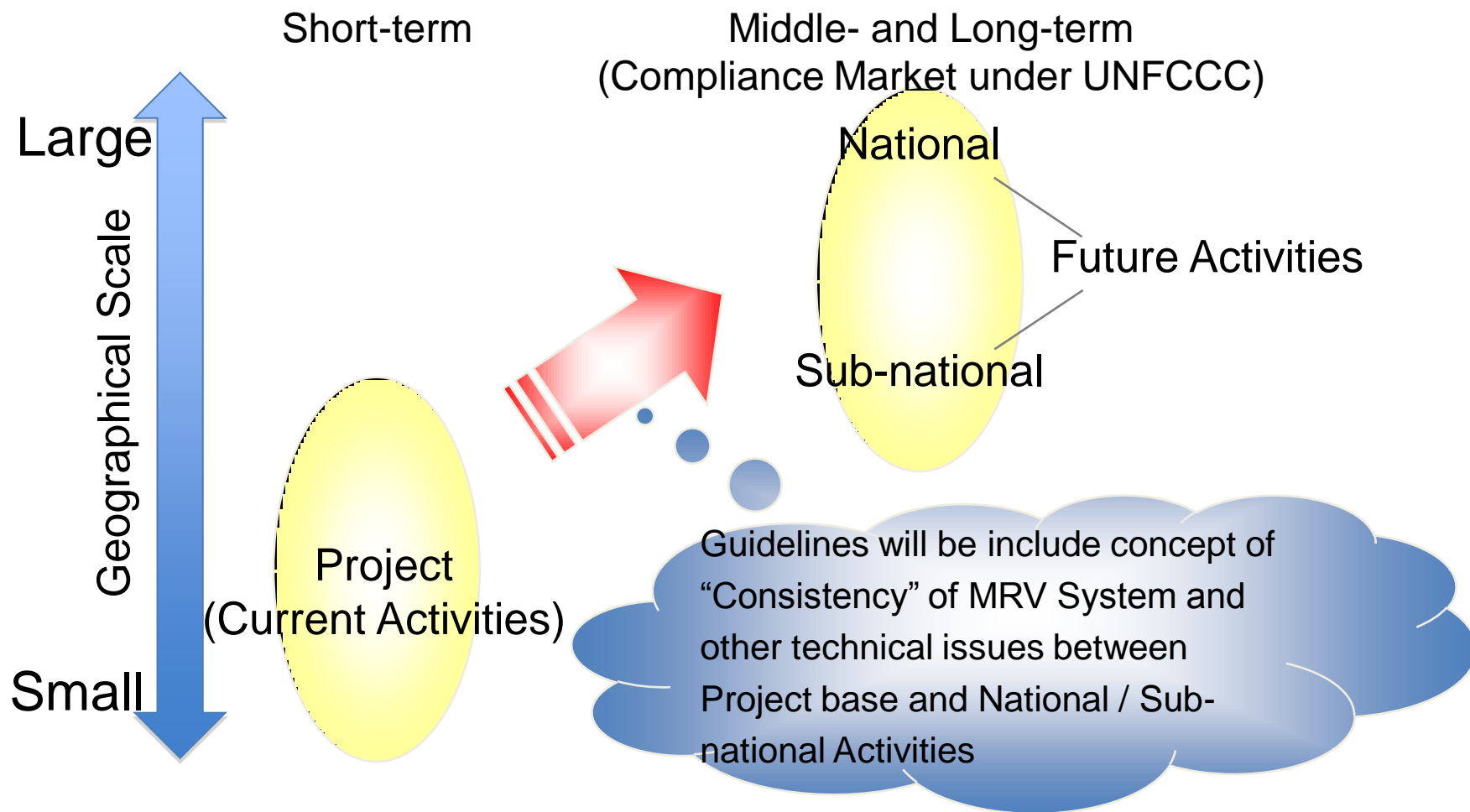
From feasibility studies, following issues are identified;

1. Efficiency and effectiveness for implementing REDD+
2. Collaboration among stakeholders

Japan does not participate in the second commitment period of the Kyoto Protocol and is considering bilateral offset/credit scheme as a potential mitigation measure.



- We are studying for development of REDD+ Guidelines, which would contribute to consider the Bilateral Carbon Offset Mechanism.
 - To be operational
 - To respect decisions under UNFCCC
 - To consider Readiness activities

(from project base to sub-national/national base)

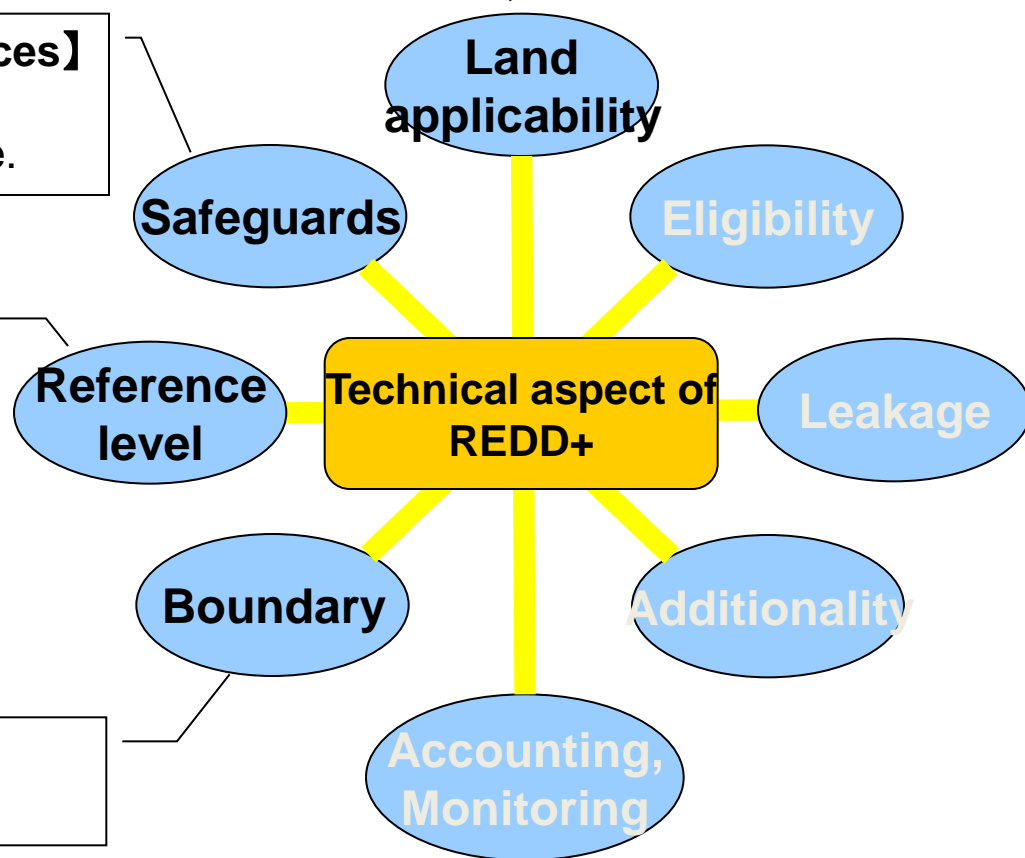
Elements 1

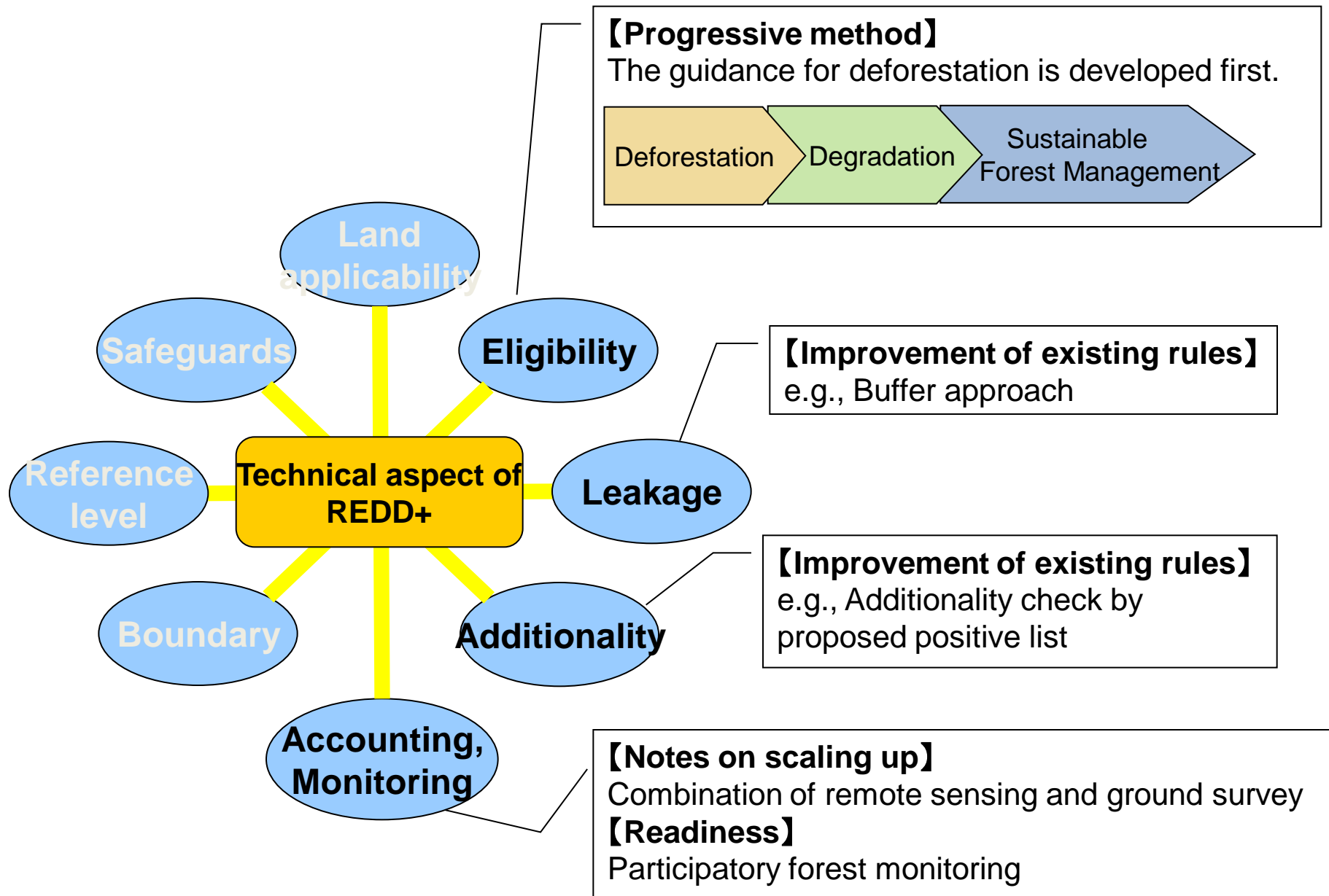
【Development of new rules】
 e.g., Oil palm is not applicable.

【Development of new rules and practices】
 •Biodiversity Conservation
 •Attention to the local / indigenous people.

【Notes on scaling-up】
 Reference level for project base and that for the sub-national / national base should be consistent.

【Notes on scaling-up】
 Avoid overlapping or cherry picking.
